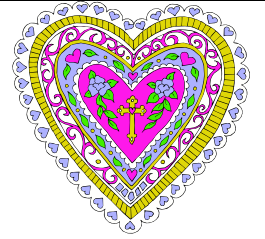

We would like 6 souper chefs as well as "bun bringers". Please sign up if you are able to help.

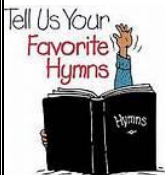
Make More of Lent
