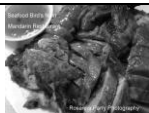

FEBRUARY 16, “GOLD FEVER” Goldcorp inc. arrives in a remote village in Guatemala. Soon follows blown up mountains, despoiled water supplies, and broken promises over jobs. As the gold frenzy brings in a profits bonanza for the company, the community launches a powerful resistance struggle. Dynamic and beautiful quality, this film provides a powerful look at the reality of what it means when gold miners dig into the 3rd world. “We have opportunities to expand in almost every direction. That won’t be a problem,” a Goldcorp official says to the workers at the mine. But for Crisanta, who refused to sell her land, it was a problem. “They had surrounded the house.... they threw gasoline inside....my brother’s entire body was in flames”
