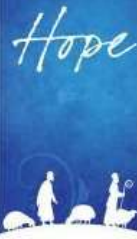


# Third Ave News

The Church office has an average of six requests a week for assistance.</p> <p>The fund is used to buy grocery gift cards and bus fare for those in need.</p>	<p>This Christmas we are planning on helping those in need from our own congregation as well as those in the greater community through a fun giving activity. We are calling it Countdown to Kindness. It is like a reverse advent calendar. Instead of getting a treat each day you can give toward a Christmas Basket. If you would like to participate, please pick up a giving string from the cork boards and open one each Sunday, Nov. 20 &amp; 27 and Dec. 4 &amp; 11.
